


Consumers Power package being sent home with Michigan school children

Here's the exterior of the package:




Here are its contents, including three CFLs (which contain the neuro-toxin, mercury):

"The East Jackson School District had a grades 9-12 dropout rate of 6% in 2008. The national grades 9-12 dropout rate in 2007 was 4.4%.

In the East Jackson School District, 16% of students have an IEP (Individualized Education Program). An IEP is a written plan for students eligible for special needs services."

With a dropout rate approaching 50% higher than the national average, it would seem that the students need education in the three R's and parental support in that effort, rather than pressure to comply with a social engineering project which has adverse medical impacts upon many people with a wide array of disabilities.
